"CHASING THE CHADWICK LINE" UPDATE

Holy smokes. I'm so excited it's difficult to keep from jumping up and down.

A month or so ago, I contacted the Christian County Library to see what additional research material they have available. For those of you who are not familiar with this area, Christian County, whose seat is the city of Ozark, contained the largest portion of the Chadwick Railroad, from the town of Cassidy all the way down to Chadwick. A few nights ago I heard back from them, and was provided with a huge cache of rare photographs relating to the railroad, most of which I had never seen before. It will be an absolute joy to sort through these images to decide which ones I want to use in the book. Deciding which ones are left out will no doubt be a tough decision. My first inclination is to use all of them, but that may not be reasonable. One thing is for certain, these pics will add greatly to the imagery of the book.

Additionally, I recently visited the Christian County Historical Society Museum, and found within their reference library many personal recollections of the train which will be wonderful to include.

All that being said, I've also been thinking about the particulars of the book itself, how it's made and what size it will be. Because it is going to be packed with historical photographs and maps, it will have to be dimensionally larger than *Sarah Burning*. I'm thinking it will be somewhere around eight inches tall and eight inches wide. Larger pages means higher resolution photographs and maps. Also, I believe it will be important to have the book printed on a higher quality paper, again for the sake of the photographs and maps. It will drive up printing costs, but I believe it will be worth it.



